“ The vineyard is 5–6 km west of Renwick, 5,000 plants/ha. 80% on Riparia Gloire rootstock for low vigour, even though it was unknown to the owners, the Bourgeois family, because of their Loire background. They panicked at the idea of high vigour so went for Riparia Gloire. No SO2 while ageing. Lots of mass-selection vines.

Mid straw – much deeper colour than the rest. Very savoury and 'French' on the nose! Real personality. Picked ripe and really satisfying with more mid palate than most. Relatively low acid and low pH (pH 3.05 and TA 5.9 g/l in 2015!). Long and tingly.
